




location and motion of the bow on the string: between **mst** at the top of the rectangle [its limit should be placed around the second octave [2nd natural harmonic] of each string]] and **xsp** at the bottom of the rectangle [the edge of the bridge]. Thick horizontal lines indicate the precise location of the bow on the string and the time line.



dynamics: traditionally notated.
Unless otherwise marked, all
dynamic changes are 'subito'.

extended bow techniques:

Jeté. Always notated in a separate layer, so its upper extreme is higher than the bow position staff. Perform always very close to the string, so the bouncing is fast and diminute.



articulation:

long vertical lines: re-attack [changing bow direction]
otherwise do not reattack

dynamic vibrato:

> > regular, strong and very strong accents.

noteheads | strings

harmonic/flageolet finger pressure (sometimes its placement does not correspond to a natural harmonic)

traditional staff: notes/pitches and their durations [horizontal lines], sometimes decoupled from bowing.

there are no continuing horizontal lines between very short notes, however, they should not be played staccato unless indicated.
